



MARC Services: Train the Trainer Evaluation Survey Data (2010-2011)

This report covers the evaluation survey data collected from individuals who participated in the Massachusetts Aggression Reduction Center's Train the Trainer Program during the academic year 2010-2011

Sample Characteristics:

306 individuals responded and completed the survey. The sample was composed of:

- 87% elementary schools/secondary schools
- 3% post-secondary settings
- 1% non-school settings
- 9% other

77% of the survey respondents were female and 22% were male. Of these respondents, 14% were classroom teachers, 45% were administrators, 35% were counseling or psychological staff, and the remainder were health educators, school resource officers, or other staff.

General Satisfaction with the Program:

General satisfaction with the program is high with 90% of respondents indicating that the training received was good to excellent. 92% indicated that the training received was clear and comprehensible and 100% of respondents indicated that they learned something new about bullying or cyber-bullying. The majority of participants were satisfied with the materials provided, with only 4% indicating that the PowerPoint presentations provided were difficult to use than a DVD and only 1% indicating that the handbook and handouts provided were difficult or confusing to use.

Impact of the Program:

Almost all (99%) of respondents indicated that they intend on using the training with their colleagues and out of the 306 participants who completed the survey, 49% (161) had already used the training they received to train others. Out of this group, almost all of them, 99%, indicated that they were successful in training others. 99% also indicated that the people who they were training were able to understand the content and 97% indicated that people were interested and engaged during the training.
